


DISTRICT PROFILE

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDER WAY:

- Copano Bay Bridge Replacement - Upgrade two-mile-long bridge over Copano Bay from two-way roadway to four-lane roadway. \$98.2 million. Completion: mid-2017.
- US 77 Improvements to interstate standards (I-69) – Nueces, Kleberg counties. Kingsville-Bishop section: \$79 million. Completion: October 2016. (Design/Build). Nueces County: Robstown to north of Driscoll, \$39 million. Completion: summer 2018.
- Corpus Christi: Complete freeway section on SH 286 from SH 357 to FM 43; \$46 million. Completion: fall 2017.

PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- Harbor Bridge replacement. US 181 Corpus Christi. Cost: \$900 million. Start summer 2016; five years for construction. (Design/Build)
- SH 358 (SPID) EB ramp reversal Corpus Christi. Planned let date: July 2016. Construction cost: \$38.2 million.
- US 281 interstate upgrade/relief route, Premont, Jim Wells County. Construction: 2020; \$65 million.
- U.S. 181 overpass Kay Bailey Hutchison Road in Portland. Cost: \$24 million. Start: summer 2017.

MAINTENANCE: The Corpus Christi district has a regular maintenance budget of \$23.1 million and spends more than \$8 million in counties affected by increased oil and gas production: Bee, Goliad, Karnes and Live Oak counties. The district anticipates spending \$15 million on seal coat projects in FY 2016.

CORRIDORS: Priority corridors include I-69/US 77, I-37, US 59, US 281, US 181, US 183 and SH 72 through the Eagle-Ford shale region.

SAFETY: Due to elevated energy production and increased urban and rural population, the district has aggressively campaigned to address fatigued and distracted drivers, i.e., wider shoulders, adding centerline and edge line rumble strips, adding passing lanes, installing traffic signals and illumination at intersections.
