




DISTRICT PROFILE

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- North Tarrant Express I-35W (Seg. 3A & 3B) – rebuild and widen - \$1.6 billion
- Midtown Express (SH 183) – rebuild and widen - \$850 million
- SH 360 South – toll road - \$330 million
- SH 360/I-30 Interchange - \$233 million
- Trinity River Vision - bridges - \$66 million
- SH 121/360 Interchange - \$61 million

PLANNED MAJOR PROJECTS:

- SH 199 – add mainlanes and bridges - \$56.5 million (2016)
- North Tarrant Express I-35W (Seg. 3C) – rebuild and widen - \$700 million (2017)
- I-820 East Loop – rebuild and widen - \$150 million (2017)

MAINTENANCE: We spend approximately \$100 million annually for preventative, routine and rehabilitative maintenance.

SAFETY: Our current and upcoming safety projects include 77 miles of added shoulders along farm-to-market roads and state highways in Erath, Hood, Johnson, Palo Pinto, Parker, Tarrant and Wise Counties.
