Meeting scheduled to discuss Interstate 20 corridor

Focus is on segment servicing FM 715 and Highway 158

MIDLAND COUNTY – An open house-style public meeting is scheduled Tuesday evening (June 18, 2013) to solicit comments from the public on entrance and exit ramps on Interstate 20 servicing the area of FM 715 and Highway 158.

The Texas Department of Transportation wants to hear from citizens concerning traffic operations on this segment of Interstate 20. A consultant has been hired to evaluate options to improve traffic flow in that area.

The meeting is scheduled from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Tuesday, June 18, 2013, in Building C of the Midland County Horseshoe Multipurpose Facility, 2514 Arena Trail, in Midland.

From 5 p.m. to 6 p.m., TxDOT will conduct an open house meeting to discuss ideas with the general public. At 6 p.m., we will have a formal presentation of the project and describe a preliminary plan.
