

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will conduct a public meeting for the purpose of soliciting public comments on the proposed improvements to Interstate Highway (IH) 35 from the Denton County line to the Red River in Cooke County, Texas. The proposed project is to provide improvements for IH 35 to accommodate future traffic needs. The project is approximately 22 miles in length. The meeting will be held at the Gainesville Civic Center, 311 South Weaver Street, Gainesville, Texas on Thursday, May 28, 2009. The public meeting will begin with an Open House from 6:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. followed by a presentation beginning at 6:30 p.m.

The intent of the public meeting is to present the Preferred Alternative developed from comments at the last public meeting and to receive public input and to discuss the next steps in the study process. Maps, drawings, and other information about the project will be on display at the meeting to allow interested persons to learn more about the proposed project. Project personnel will be available to assist in orientation and interpretation of the drawings and other material on hand and discuss possible mobility and environmental effects of the proposed project.

Each attendee will have the opportunity to provide the project team with comments and suggestions by discussion with the project team or by submitting written comments. All interested persons are invited to attend this Public Meeting and express their views on the proposed project.
