




DISTRICT PROFILE

- SH 249 Extension in Grimes Co.
-Est. cost \$100 million
-Design build project with Houston District. Section in Montgomery County.
-Project anticipated beginning in 2018.
- IH 45 Widening to 6 lanes in Walker County
-From Montgomery County to 6 miles north
-Est. cost \$130 million
-Construction to begin 2017.
