DBE Goal Setting

- Current FHWA statewide goal is 12.6%
- Race Conscious 6.8%
- Race Neutral 5.8%
- Factors for individual contract goals include:
 - Type of work
 - Subcontracting opportunities
 - Demographics (i.e., location of project, surrounding districts, DBE availability in the surrounding area, etc.)
 - Final adjustment based on year-to-date effort in meeting the race conscious goal and overall goal

Certified DBEs

- Almost 4,400 certified DBEs in Texas
- Roughly 75% located in 5 metro districts
- Over 1,000 located in the Houston District


