Re: Amnesty for Permits

Dear Outdoor Advertising Licensee:

As a part of the centralization of the Outdoor Advertising Regulatory Program, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) sent a letter dated June 28, 2011 to all licensees providing the opportunity to bring permits up-to-date if the permits had expired during the period from January 1, 2008 through June 30, 2011.

TxDOT sent a letter to all licenses on March 28, 2013 with notification that after a year in development, TxDOT was going to release a more efficient method of annual renewals of licenses and permits through an online procedure. The same letter provided instructions to licensees for setup of their online electronic account.

The new online electronic license and permit renewal program was released for full distribution on April 5, 2013. The release of the new online renewal system correlated to the completion of processing all paperwork received from licensees for the Amnesty period. Thus, the original Amnesty program that began in 2011 officially ends effective the close of business on June 5, 2013.

If there are any Amnesty issues that have not been finalized, you as the licensee are responsible to make your submissions to TxDOT before the Amnesty period closes at the end of business on June 5, 2013.
