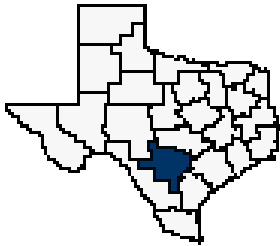




DISTRICT PROFILE

The San Antonio District plans, designs, builds, operates and maintains the state transportation system in 12 counties. In addition to maintaining assets in the Alamo City, the district focuses on mobility projects to address congestion through the vital corridors intersecting in the district.

KEY CORRIDOR PLANS

- I-35 NEX: Expansion to improve the Central portion of I-35 to a 14-lane expressway between I-410 N to FM 3009 is scheduled to begin in Spring 2022.
- US 281: Phase 1 to expand to 6-lane expressway with frontage roads between LP 1604 and Stone Oak Pkwy completed in 2021. Phase 2 which continues to the Bexar-Comal county line began in Spring 2019 and is expected to be completed in 2023.
- Loop 1604: Expansion plans for the entire loop are scheduled over the next 10 years, including an expansion to a 10-lane expressway between SH 16 (Bandera Road) and Redland Road with direct connectors at I-10. Segment 1 between SH 16 (Bandera Road) to I-10 began in Spring 2021.
- I-10: Ongoing expansion and improvement projects between Loop 1604 and Boerne and between I-410 and FM 1518. Future expansion and improvement plans for I-10 East are being developed from FM 1518 to Seguin over the next 10 years.
- Comal County: Loop 337, FM 306 and Hwy 46 expansion work underway.

MAINTENANCE: Our maintenance budget is about \$200 million annually. Our major expenditures include pavement preservation, traffic management and roadside maintenance.

SAFETY: Our safety program focuses on reducing traffic fatalities through education, engineering and enforcement. This involves safety campaigns, roadway upgrades including pedestrian facilities and clearer pavement marking, grant funding to police agencies like our Selective Traffic Enforcement Program and the Highway Emergency Response Operator (HERO) program.
