

Amarillo Boulevard (BI-40D) FACT SHEET

Three Main Project Goals

Improve Safety

- Lengthen and add left turn lanes at cross-overs
- Upgrade/extend existing lighting
- Install median barrier

Preserve Mobility

- Balance access need with the functionality of the roadway
- Improve efficiency of turning movements

Improve Pedestrian Access

- Construct a continuous Shared Use Path (SUP) both Eastbound and Westbound that meets current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards

Project Information

Amarillo Blvd (BI-40D), between I-40 West and SW 9th Ave (SL 279) in Amarillo, Potter County, Texas for approximately 3.9 miles.

Scope of Work

The project proposes to add safety improvements along Amarillo Blvd (BI 40-D) from I-40 to SW 9th Ave (SL 279) consisting of adding median left turn lanes, removing crossovers, adding safety treatment of fixed objects, installing median safety cable barrier and safety lighting, and pavement repair and overlay. The proposed project will provide bicycle and pedestrian accommodations with a 12-foot shared-use path and 6-foot sidewalks adjacent to the roadway.

No right of way or land acquisitions are needed for this project.

- Conceptual Design – Spring 2023
- Open House / Public Meeting #1 – Spring 2023
- Environmental Planning – Summer 2023
- Open House / Public Meeting #2 – Summer 2023
- Construction – 2025
