Virtual Public Meeting FM 2154 (Wellborn Road) Widening From SH 40 (William D. Fitch Parkway) to Greens Prairie Road Brazos County CSJ: 0540-04-074

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in collaboration with the City of College Station and the Bryan/College Station Metropolitan Planning Organization (BCS MPO) is proposing improvements to FM 2154 (Wellborn Road) from SH 40 (William D. Fitch Parkway) to Greens Prairie Road in Brazos County, Texas. The proposed improvements consist of a roadway widening and raised medians to enhance safety, increase capacity, as well as provide bicycle and pedestrian accommodations along the corridor.

This notice advises the public that TxDOT will be conducting an on-line virtual public meeting on the proposed project. The virtual meeting will be available starting on **Wednesday, November 10, 2021 at 3:00 p.m.** To log onto the virtual public meeting, go to the following web address: www.txdot.gov, keyword search "FM 2154 Brazos".

Project staff will give a pre-recorded presentation that will include both audio and visual components. Please note that the presentation will not be available on the website until the time and date listed above. between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, to ask questions and access project materials during the project development process. Formal comments may be provided by mail or email as explained below.

The existing FM 2154 (Wellborn Road) between SH 40 (William D. Fitch Parkway) and Greens Prairie Road consists primarily of a two-lane undivided roadway, which widens to accommodate a center turn lane at various intersections along the corridor. The existing Right of Way (ROW) width varies between 90 and 170 feet. Currently, there are limited bicycle and pedestrian accommodations along the corridor.

The proposed FM 2154 would be widened to accommodate four lanes, two in each direction, separated by a raised median. At primary intersections, the raised median would taper to accommodate a dedicated left turn lane. Additional improvements include curb and gutter, and a shared-use path along the east side of the roadway.

The proposed project would, subject to final design considerations, require additional right of way and potential displacements. Relocation assistance is available for displaced persons and businesses. Information concerning services and benefits available to affected property owners, and information about the tentative schedule for right of way acquisition and construction, can be obtained from the TxDOT district office by calling (979) 778-9607.

Any environmental documentation or studies, maps and drawings showing the project location and design, tentative construction schedules, and other information regarding the proposed project are available online at www.txdot.gov, keyword search "FM 2154 Brazos".

The virtual public meeting will be conducted in English. If you need an interpreter or document translator because English is not your primary language or you have difficulty communicating in English, one will be provided to you. If you have a disability and need assistance, special arrangements can be made to accommodate most needs.
