SH 105 Widening Project
From SH 249 to SH 6

Grimes County, Texas

The Texas Department of Transportation – Bryan District is proposing improvements to SH 105 from SH 249 to SH 6 in Grimes County, Texas. This notice advises the public that TxDOT will be conducting a public meeting on the proposed project.

The meeting will be held on **Thursday, September 19, 2024, from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. at the Grimes County Fairgrounds, 5220 FM 3455, Navasota, Texas 77868**. Attendees will be able to come and go as they please to review project displays and ask questions of TxDOT staff and/or consultants in an open house format. The purpose of the meeting is to present the proposed project and receive public comment. On the day of the public meeting, the information presented will be made available online on the TxDOT website www.txdot.gov, keyword search "SH 105 Widening".

The proposed project would widen the existing two-lane highway to a four-lane divided highway, two lanes in each direction separated by a grass median. The improvements would include construction of a direct connect interchange at the intersection of SH 6 and SH 105. The direct connect interchange would connect SH 105 westbound to SH 6 northbound and SH 6 southbound to SH 105 eastbound. Additionally, the intersection of SH 105 with FM 362 and CR 415 would be reconfigured to a grade separated overpass. The project length is approximately 6.5 miles.

The proposed project, subject to final design considerations, would require additional right-of-way and potentially include displacements. Relocation assistance is available for displaced persons and businesses. Information about the TxDOT Relocation Assistance Program and services and benefits for those displaced and other affected property owners, as well as information about the tentative schedule for right-of-way acquisition and construction, can be obtained from the TxDOT Bryan Right-of-Way office by calling (979) 778-9716.

The proposed project could involve construction in a floodplain and wetlands. Once the schematic design is developed further, environmental analysis will be conducted to identify and assess impacts.

Any environmental documentation or studies, maps and drawings showing the project location and design, tentative construction schedules, and other information regarding the proposed project are on file and available for inspection by appointment Monday through Friday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. at the TxDOT Bryan District Office located at 2591 North Earl Rudder Freeway, Bryan, Texas 77803, (979) 778-9231. This information also will be available for inspection at the meeting.



The public meeting will be conducted in English. If you need an interpreter or document translator because English is not your primary language or you have difficulty communicating in English, one will be provided to you. If you have a disability and need assistance, special arrangements can be made to accommodate most needs. All comments must be received on or before Friday, October 4, 2024, to be included as part of the official meeting record. Responses to comments received will be on file and available for inspection at the TxDOT Bryan District Office once they have been prepared.
