SH 30 (Harvey Road) Corridor Plan From Associates Avenue to FM 158 CSJ: 2446-01-032 Brazos County, Texas

The Texas Department of Transportation – Bryan District, in collaboration with Brazos County and the City of College Station, is developing a corridor plan to improve SH 30 from Associates Avenue to FM 158 in Brazos County, Texas. This notice advises the public that TxDOT will be conducting a public meeting on the proposed corridor plan.

The meeting will be held on **Tuesday, December 9, 2025, from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the Meyer Senior & Community Center, 2275 Dartmouth Street, College Station, Texas 77840**. Attendees will be able to come and go as they please to review informational displays and ask questions of staff in an open house format. The purpose of the meeting is to present the proposed corridor plan and receive public comments. On the day of the public meeting, the information presented will be made available online on the TxDOT website, www.txdot.gov, keyword search "SH 30 Corridor Plan".

The corridor plan would address future growth by adding travel lanes to increase roadway capacity and accommodate current and future traffic volumes, enhance safety and reduce crash rates by upgrading the roadway to current design standards, and provide new pedestrian and bicycle facilities. Proposed improvements include widening the existing two-lane roadway to a four-lane roadway, two lanes in each direction, and upgrading intersections to improve traffic flow. Total length of the corridor plan is approximately 2 miles. Additional right-of-way would be required to implement the corridor plan.

The proposed corridor plan would require right-of-way acquisition along SH 30 from Veterans Park and Athletic Complex (3101 Harvey Road, College Station, Texas 77845) and Summit Crossing Park (3880 Alamosa Street, College Station, Texas 77845) but would not impact the existing function of the parks. TxDOT anticipates making a *de minimis* determination for this use under Section 4(f) of the Department of Transportation Act of 1966. Public comment on the effects of the proposed corridor plan on the activities, features, or attributes of Veterans Park and Athletic Complex and Summit Crossing Park may be submitted as described below.

The proposed corridor plan may involve construction in wetlands.

The proposed corridor plan would involve an action in a floodplain.

Any environmental documentation or studies, maps and drawings showing the corridor plan location and design, and other information regarding the proposed plan are on file and available for inspection, by appointment only, Monday through Friday between the hours of



8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. at TxDOT Bryan District Office, 2591 North Earl Rudder Freeway, Bryan, Texas 77803-5190, (979) 778-9231.

The public meeting will be conducted in English. If you need an interpreter or document translator because English is not your primary language or you have difficulty communicating in English, one will be provided to you. If you have a disability and need assistance, special arrangements can be made to accommodate most needs. Please be aware that advance notice is required as some services and accommodations may require time for TxDOT to arrange.

Written comments from the public regarding the proposed corridor plan are requested and may be presented at the meeting.
