Improvements to SH 286 December 7, 2017

What is an Environmental Assessment?

- Document required by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) for construction of projects that use federal highway funds.
- Discloses project information, describes the project and study areas, and analyzes possible environmental consequences associated with construction.
- Includes public involvement at the beginning and throughout the project development process.
- Must be approved by TxDOT Environmental Affairs Division before right of way acquisition and construction can begin.

What is the State Highway (SH) 286 Improvement Project?

- Project is located south of Corpus Christi and would extend from Farm to Market Road (FM) 43 (Weber Road) to south of FM 2444 (S. Staples Street)
- Approximate length: 3.4 miles

Project Improvements:

- Existing 2-lane roadway with 100 feet of right of way
- Proposed extension of 4-lane expressway and frontage roads would require 400 feet of right of way (additional 300 feet)
- Acquisition of ROW to the west would:
 - Match SH 286 to the north
 - Avoid major utility conflict
 - Avoid impacts to potential historic resources
- Overpasses would be added a CR 20A, CR 22, and FM 2444
- Project may be built in phases

Project Development Phases and Anticipated Timeline

Initial Development of Alternatives	Summer/Fall 2017
Alternative Refinement	Fall 2017
Public Meeting	Fall 2017
Preparation of Final Design Schematic	Winter 2017/2018
Prepare Environmental Document (EA)	Winter-Fall 2018
Opportunity for a Public Hearing	Fall 2018
