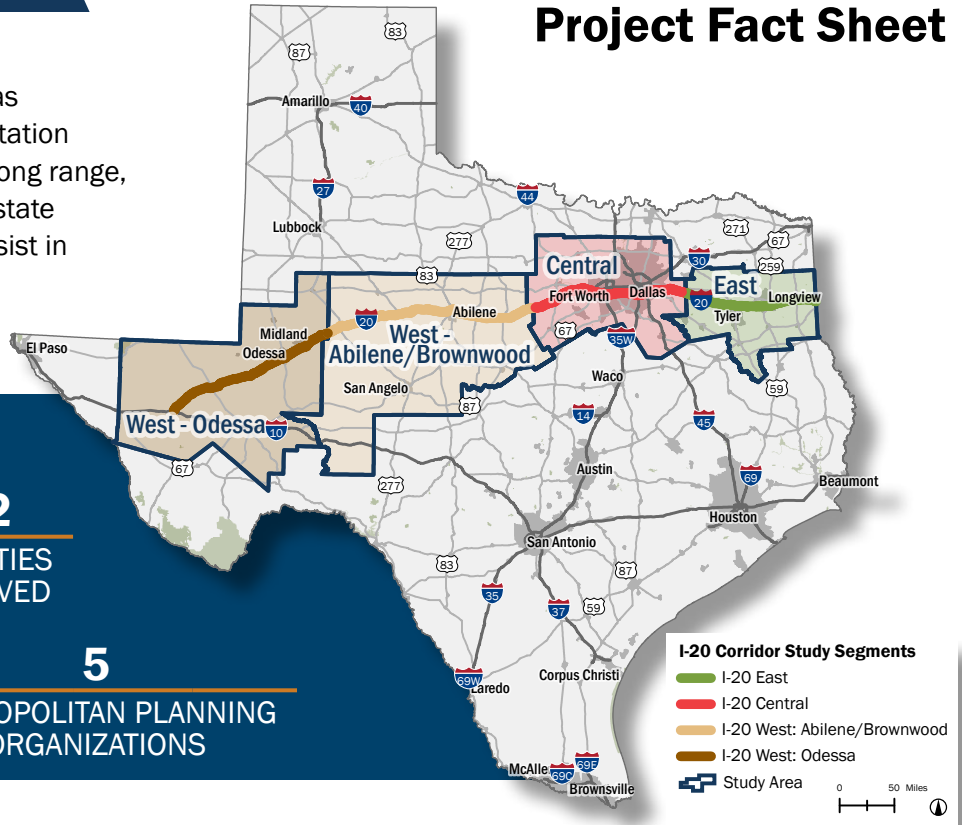


Project Fact Sheet

Connectivity / Continuity of Frontage Roads



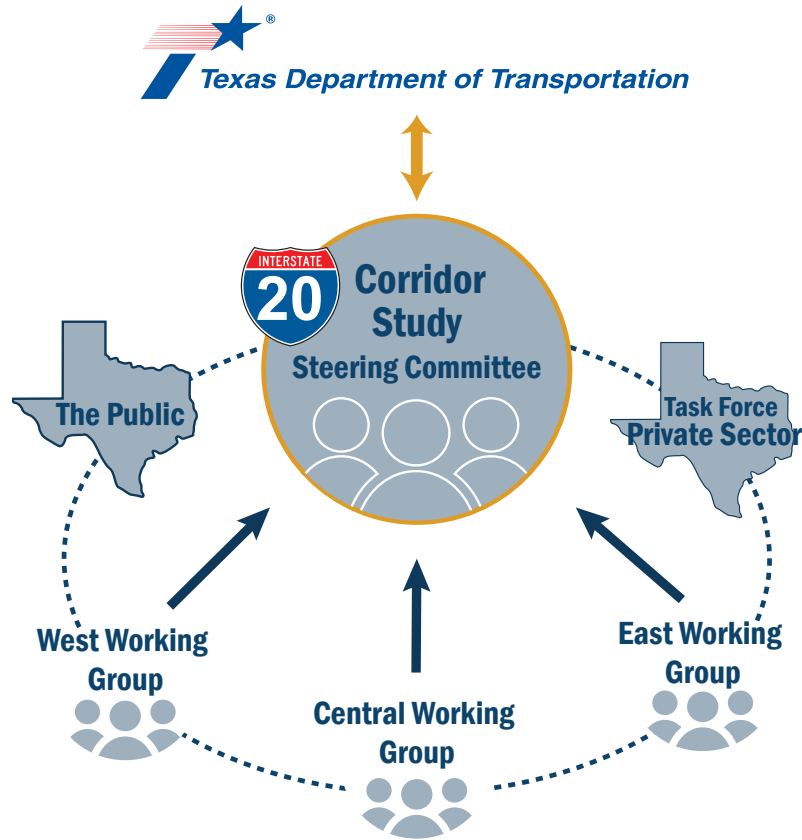

Stakeholder and Public Engagement

Stakeholder and public engagement are critical components of the study. The study will be guided through a Corridor Steering Committee with input from three Segment Working Groups, TxDOT Districts, the public, and the private sector.

The Corridor Steering Committee, Segment Working Groups, and private sector focus group members include:

- County Judges or their representatives
- City Mayors or their representatives
- Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) representatives
- Texas Farm Bureau
- Members of the Texas Trucking Association and freight industry representatives
- Economic Development Organizations and Chambers of Commerce
- Agriculture, energy and international trade sectors
- Representatives from the Texas Freight Advisory Committee and Border Trade Advisory Committees
- Representatives from New Mexico and Louisiana among others
- Potential private sector representatives
