Why Improvements are Needed

The SH 115 North Project is considering design alternatives for improving safety and mobility along SH 115 from SH 128 (Andrews County) to SH 349 (Lamesa County). The goal of the project is to improve safety along SH 115 by accommodating traffic growth and enhancing mobility in the area. The crash rate along this corridor is higher than the statewide average, with many collisions involving heavy trucks.

Between 2015 and 2019 there was a 60 percent increase in traffic volume. Along SH 115 between SH 128 and SH 349 it is anticipated that traffic volume will increase another 60 percent by 2044. Forty percent of existing traffic volume includes heavy trucks. There were 224 crashes between 2016 and 2020 with fourteen fatalities.

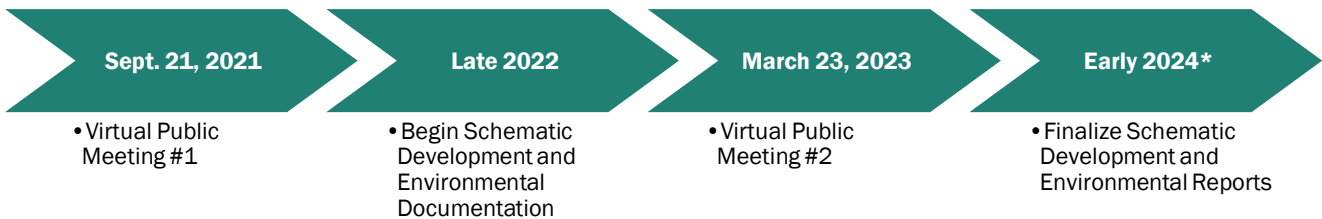
Project Overview

Proposed improvements would include:

- Widening to a four-lane divided highway, with two lanes in each direction.
- Adding a non-paved depressed median to provide a safe separation buffer between opposing directions of traffic.
- Realigning a 5-mile segment of SH 115 on the north end of the project, near Patricia.

The overall project is approximately 55 miles in length. At this time, no improvements are proposed within the city of Andrews.
