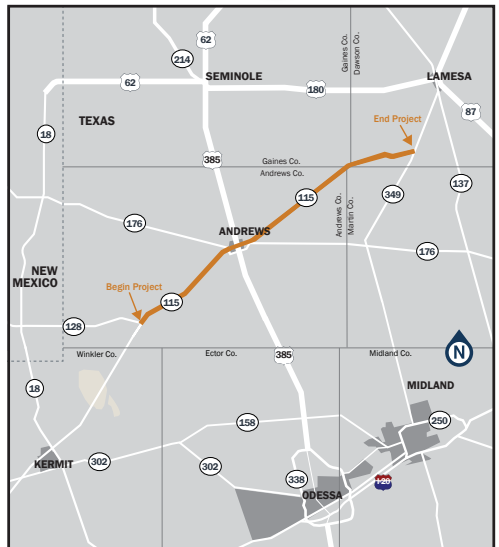


The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is holding a virtual public meeting to review proposed improvements to SH 115 from SH 128 to SH 349 in Andrews, Dawson, Gaines and Martin counties, Texas. The overall project is approximately 55 miles in length, with 21 miles west of the city of Andrews and 34 miles east of the city of Andrews.

Proposed improvements include:

- Widening the existing two-lane undivided highway to a four-lane divided highway, with two lanes in each direction
- Adding a non-paved depressed median to provide a safe separation buffer between opposing directions of traffic
