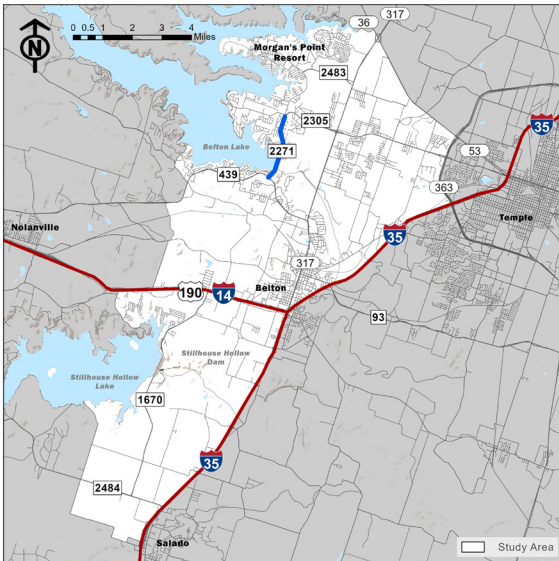


FM 2271 Extension Regional Feasibility Study

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is conducting a Regional Feasibility Study to examine the feasibility of extending Farm-to-Market (FM) Road 2271 in Bell County. Extending FM 2271 could increase connectivity in the area by offering additional travel options to residents and visitors. The limits of existing FM 2271 and the entire study area are shown on the map below.
